# Restoring Hope and Purpose

As Executive Director of Jericho Road Ministries, I am often asked the question, "What does Jericho Road do?" I could then talk about addiction treatment, feeding the poor, housing the mentally ill, but the real work of Jericho Road is to restore hope and purpose by connecting people to God's grace and love. This is our work because this is what God does.

Psalm 147:3 says, God heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.



When fighting the seemingly endless cycles of poverty, addiction and mental illness, life can be overwhelming. Worn down by failure, wounded first three Addiction Recovby broken relationships, people cry out, "What's the use? Why even try?" Hope is lost. But God knows our needs and he can restore us. I love the intimacy in this verse in Psalm 147. greater than ourselves can re-God gets personally involved. He gets his hands dirty. He comes close and touches our wounded, broken places. God restores hope and purpose to life.

So "What does Jericho Road do?" We connect people to the God who gives life and hope. As stated in the ery steps, we admit our need, "- that our lives had become unmanageable" and "we come to believe that a Power store us to sanity." We connect people to God so they can "turn their will and their lives over to the care of God" and let Him heal their broken hearts and wounded souls.

### One Day At A Time

### The 12 Steps

- **1:** We admitted we were powerless over alcohol--that our lives had become unmanageable.
- **2:** Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
- **3:** Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.
- **4:** Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- **5:** Admitted to God, to ourselves and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- **6:** Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
- **7:** Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
- **8:** Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
- **9:** Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
- **10:** Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.
- **11:** Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God, as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
- **12:** Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.


### Philosophy of Ministry:



At **Jericho Road Ministries**, we are not satisfied with simply "housing" people or getting them off the streets. The houses are the place that the real work of recovery, discipleship and Christ-centered living happens.

### **Second-stage Recovery Homes**

Second stage homes are our emphasis this year. Building on the foundation work of the Discipleship House recovery program, all JRM second stage homes are now recovery homes. These homes support recovery routines such as attendance at AA and 12-step meetings, relapse prevention classes and community service. Structured routines are needed for good mental health and addiction recovery, so our 2<sup>nd</sup>-stage homes provide a balance of work and rest, personal responsibility and participation in community living. We hope to even develop a social enterprise that will provide skill training and work opportunities. But the foundation of these homes is a connection with God – Always pointing them to God as their hope and provider.
