

I needed to hear that. His message carried me through another day. And the message of recovery—the one he heard—has been carrying him, too.

JARED'S STORY

Before coming to Jericho Road, Jared's life was spiraling. Homeless, isolated, and battling depression, he had exhausted every option. "I wouldn't have survived much longer," he shared. But at Jericho Road, everything changed.

At first, the program's nine-month commitment felt overwhelming. Jared doubted whether he could make it through or open himself up to a new way of living. But just weeks in, he attended a recovery celebration where a graduate shared his story—and something shifted. "If he could have his life restored, I came to believe so could I."

Jared's transformation was deep and lasting. "I feel unburdened by my past, forgiven, and supported in my individuality." Eventually, he joined the staff team, offering the same compassionate support he once received. "Now, I get to listen with my mind, heart, and spirit."

For Jared, Jericho Road is sacred ground: a place where healing happens, community is real, and God works miracles. "There's a community here that will love you through it."

Because of your support, men like Jared are finding hope—and building new lives.

A YEAR OF GROWTH AND BEGINNINGS

In 2024, Jericho Road experienced significant growth, thanks to our community's generosity. Our farm produces over 800 pounds of fresh food annually for local partners and residents, nourishing both bodies and spirits.

With support from the Ontario Trillium Foundation, we improved the Discipleship House, adding paved driveways and a new boiler system. Additional funding from the Province of Ontario helped install new CCTV cameras to enhance safety and security.

This year, we launched Horse Therapy, led by Joanne Routhier, offering residents a path to emotional healing.

We also finalized our Leadership
Development Program & Workbook, which
will soon be available to equip future
community leaders. Each step this year
reminds us: transformation occurs when hope
meets action—and this is all possible
because of you.
